### **PMCWA Position Statement:**

## Delivery Mode of Junior Medical Officer Education

#### 1. Purpose

To articulate PMCWA's position on the delivery of JMO education by HSP.

#### 2. Context

The disruption to the usual programs for Clinical teaching after the COVID-19 pandemic physical distancing requirements, has resulted in many face-to-face teaching sessions being replaced with on-line delivery.

The purpose of this Position Statement is to articulate that face-to-face delivery of medical education is the preferred method.

#### 3. Position Statement

The PMCWA promotes and supports the training of medical staff in their prevocational years.

PMCWA promotes the traditional face-to-face delivery of medical education as being crucially important, and as such, should be the cornerstone modality where possible. Face-to-face teaching as a model of medical education delivery has many additional benefits including:

- peer support and networking for JMOs
- opportunities for JMOs to connect and develop relationships with senior clinicians
- opportunities for medical educators and supervisors to check in on the progress and wellbeing of JMOs resulting in early identification of doctors in difficulty.
